### HOSPITAL SCHOOLS

Mon, Tues, Thurs 9.00 am - 8.30 pm, Wed - 9.30 am - 3.30 pm

The Newcastle City Learning's ESOL Service operates in the West and East end of Newcastle and delivers English tuition to people for whom English is not their first language. The curriculum covers speaking and listening, reading and writing skills. Around 450 learners attend courses annually. Most learners are accommodated in Westgate community college and Heaton Adult Centre.

### **CSV Northumbria** - Young adults at risk of offending

Kyloe House is a purpose built secure children's home. It provides safe and secure accommodation for a mixed group of up to 12 young people. You will be working alongside teachers to support young learners at the unit as they work on individualised learning programmes specific to their needs.

### **Skills 4u North East**

A social enterprise, working with young people who have become disaffected and disengaged and at serious risk of underachievement. Skills 4u North East strive to re-engage young people with the world of education training and work by not replicating the school curriculum and mainstream education methods, but instead searching for innovative and creative approaches.

Cowgate Family Support Volunteer Project (no website) - supporting local families with children over 5

Cowgate is a deprived community in Newcastle and this new project (started in late 2010) is an attempt to encourage community spirit and get residents involved in making their community a safer, happier place for children, young people and families. The project also provides local volunteers with accredited training which raises levels of self-confidence and self-esteem and improved employability chances. There is an opportunity for one student to support the monitoring of the project, interviewing a wide range of subjects and working with a professional from Newcastle Local Authority to draw up reports, collate and present data etc.

### **Aquila Way**

Aquila Way is a Christian charity based in the North East of England providing support and accommodation to young people and families who are homeless, through a number of specialised and innovative projects. Aquila Way can host placements in three of its projects:

Aquila Mentoring Project (AMP) – Prison access Tuesday (all day) and community support Mon – Fri, 9am – 5pm

AMP works with young men and women from 16 + who are or have been in prison. Staff are motivated to see a change in the lives of the service users they engage with and support resettling into Tyne and Wear.

AMP's vision is to see individual's lives positively and permanently transformed by:

- supporting integration into communities;
- supporting service users to become socially and economically active;
- encouraging active participation in bringing up children;
- positively changing the negative image of disadvantaged young people in wider society by promoting the successes in young peoples' lives.

Basis@336 – Open Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9am to 2pm.

Basis@336 is a homeless drop in centre providing shower and laundry facilities, housing and benefit support and a Rent Deposit Guarantee Scheme.

Edberts House – Open Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9am to 5pm

Edberts House is a community centre working with all age groups, encouraging community cohesion. Providing mother and toddler groups, healthy eating groups and support for service users to enter employment, further education or training.

**The Families Information Service (FIS)** provide comprehensive, accurate, up-to-date information on childcare and other local services and support for parents of children

and young people up to the age of 20.

As part of the new Disability and Additional Needs Service (DANS) launched in May 2011, North Tyneside FIS is now equipped to provide access to specialist information and offer a general advisory and signposting service to children and young people with disabilities or additional needs, their families, carers and professionals who are working in support of those children and families.

This placement offers the opportunity to undertake an evaluation exercise of this new provision to assess how it is viewed by service users and how it might be further developed. This is an ideal opportunity for a student to undertake a qualitative research project from design through to final report.

**The Participation and Engagement Team** work with young people to increase their participation in relevant decision making and consultation forums e.g. North Tyneside Youth Council. The Participation and Engagement team offer students the opportunity to support bodies such as National Teenage Pregnancy Support and Drink Aware.
