1. ANGUS, George: Catalogue of a valuable collection of books which will be sold by auction, on Tuesday 29th January 1823 . . . on the premises . . . lately occupied by Mr. George Angus. Printed sheet.
2. PLOMER, William C.F. to Dr. W.S. Mitchell, Librarian of King's College, 24th July 1959. Writes of his intention to present "a book about Bewick" to the Library. (Refers to *Wood Engravings* by Thomas Bewick, selected by Reynolds Atone. Bradshaw-Bewick 761 BEW.) Autograph.
3. HOUSEMAN, A.E.: Three letters. To J.P. Postgate (22nd February 1908), to "Mr. Wilson" (7th January 1927), and to an unidentified correspondent (25th January 1926). Autograph.
4. BEWICK, Thomas to William Davison, printer of Alnwick, 25th October 1816. Asks for payment of remaining sum due for illustrations Bewick had designed for Thomas Percy's *The Hermit of Warkworth*.
5. BEWICK, Thomas: Holograph manuscript of a poem in Tyneside dialect, headed by a pen and ink drawing of a woman and child.
6. BROWNING, Elizabeth Barratt: Stanzas in holograph from "Calls on the heart", including Stanza VII and others apparently not used.
7. BROWNING, Elizabeth Barrett: "Queen Annelida and False Arcite". Stanzas I – XXX, in holograph.
8. INGHAM, William to Mr. Smiles of Edinburgh, 29th April 1804, on the possibility of a vacancy for a surgeon at the infirmary in Newcastle, with advice on how to apply for such a post. Autograph.
9. CRAIG, Edward Gordon: Two autograph postcards to Professor W.L. Renwick, March 5th and July 25th 1926. Refers to the design of the Armstrong College presentation bookplate.
10. ELPHINSTONE, George Keith, later Viscount Keith: Document authorising the payment of a bounty to naval volunteers, 12th November 1795. Marked "copy" and addressed to Mr. Alexander Farquhar. Signed by Elphinstone.
11. THRALE, Mrs. Hester Lynch to Fanny Burney insisting that she should stay with her until the roads to Chessington became passable. Autograph. (Undated but paper cannot be earlier than 1780, and Mrs. Thrale became Mrs. Piozzi in 1784.)
12. BURNEY, Frances to Dr. Charles Burney, 12th April 1792, discussing his health and her own. Autograph.

13. BURNEY, Frances to Dr. Charles Burney. Undated (first sheet missing), but probably written from Bookham between 5th April and 10th July 1794. Discusses French politics and her newly married life in the country. Autograph.
14. NELSON, Horatio to Rev. A.J. Scott, 31st July 1801. Autograph. (Scott was later present at Nelson's death-bed on the *Victory*.)
15. CHATEAUBRIAND, F.A.R. Vicomte de.: Setter in French to an unidentified English correspondent, dated 29th ---? 1834. Autograph.
16. WELLINGTON, Arthur Wellesley, 1st Duke: Two letters acknowledging letters received by him from Mr. Rawling(?) (23rd August 1835) and Miss Bennett(?) (4th May 1840). Autograph.
17. WYON, William to "My dear Louisa", 13th July 1840. Explains how to obtain admission to the Royal Academy. Autograph.
18. BRUNEL, Isambard Kingdom to unidentified correspondent, 18th April 1840. Arranges a railway journey to Didcot. Autograph.
19. LANDON, Letitia Elizabeth to S.C. Hall, c. 1830(?). On the publication of her poetry. Autograph.
20. KENT, Prince Edward, Duke of Kent (4th son of George III) to the Rev. John Owen, 18th April 1818. Excusing himself from attending service the next day. Secretary's hand; signed by the Duke.
21. YORK, Prince Frederick, Duke of York and Albany (2nd son of George III) to an auctioneer, 8th May 1821. Requesting him to obtain for him two pairs of Dutch pedestals coming up at auction the following week.
22. BRUNEL, Sir Marc Isambard to Miss L. Kennett, 30th April 1827. Gives particulars of admission to the Thames tunnel. Autograph.
23. BRUNEL, Sir Marc Isambard: Printed sheet, dated June 1832, giving description of Thames tunnel and appealing for financial aid to complete it.
24. WILBERFORCE, William to Miss Owen, 16th September 1831. Mainly on his health. Autograph.
25. CAMPBELL, Thomas to Dr. Blyth, 8th September 1840. Asks to see him, and would like "a short conversation with those who are to have the regulation of the launch". Autograph.
26. ALISON, Sir Archibald, 22nd April 1841. Thanks recipient for dedicating book to him. Autograph.

27. MOORE, Thomas to Mrs Samuel Carter Hall, 18th April 1842. Agrees to write in her album and mentions bad health of his second son. Autograph.
28. PROUT, Samuel to Samuel Carter Hall, c.1840(?). Thanks him for praise of his pictures. Autograph.
29. WELLESLEY, Richard Colley, Marquis Wellesley to Mr. M----(?), dated "August 22nd". Asks for details of post to India. Autograph.
30. ETTY, William to Samuel Carter Hall, dated "Saturday 27th --?. Morning". Apologises for the late despatch of exhibition catalogue of his pictures. Autograph.
31. HUNT, J.H. Leigh to Samuel Carter Hall, 18th May 18--. Mentions Shelley and Keats. Autograph.
32. TALLEYRAND-PERIGORD, Prince Charles Maurice de: Letter, signed and annotated by Talleyrand, on official Republique Francaise Relations Exterieur note paper, dated 16 Thermidor, 1^{er} an 7 (3rd August 1799), requesting an acknowledgement of a communication.
33. ELLIS, Havelock to Mr. Denwood/Denward, 28th May 1924. Discusses different editions of his works. Autograph.
34. ALBEMARLE, George Monk, 1st Duke of Albermarle: Printed requisition notice for money to pay for the victualling of the fleet, dated 6th June 1668 and signed "Albermarle".
35. GRAINGER, Richard to Robert Watson, 19th September 1836. Asks if he would be prepared to sell his brass foundry, situated just off the line of the proposed new Grey St., as the fumes would disturb the amenities of the new Turk's Head Inn. In secretary's hand, but signed by Grainger.
36. GRAINGER, Richard: Printed broadside prospectus, signed by Grainger and dated 14th December 1838, giving an engraving and plan of a proposed central exchange and news room in Newcastle. Sent to Silvanus Thompson of Liverpool.
37. STEPHENSON, George to Robert Watson Senior, 7th June 1816. About the design of the miner's safety lamps. Autograph.
38. FARADAY, Michael. Holograph draft of his wishes regarding the disposal of personal effects after his death, including a request that his scientific papers should go to the Royal Institution. Signed by Faraday and dated 16th January 1855.

39. EDWARD, Prince of Wales (later King Edward VII) to "Mrs Eliot", 22nd December 1878. Expresses deep regret at the death of her husband. Autograph. (Addressee is probably Mrs Eliot Yorke, sister of Lady Battersea, whose husband died at the end of 1878.)
40. LOUISE VICTORIA ALEXANDRA DAGMAR, Princess Royal to "My dear Annie" (probably Mrs. Eliot Yorke). Says she will be unable to attend the conference of the National Union of Teachers in Portsmouth, 19--. Undated. Autograph.
41. BEATRICE MARY VICTORIA FEODORE, Princess. Postcard to Mrs. Yorke from Osborne Cottage, 28th December 1901. Thanks her for Christmas present of "a charming little book stand". Autograph.
42. CAMBRIDGE, George William Frederick Charles, Duke of Cambridge to Sir Anthony de Rothschild, 4th December 1875, thanking him for gift of *pate de fois gras*. Autograph.
43. ARNOLD, Matthew to Lady de Rothschild, 2nd April [186-]. Refers to his intention of writing an article on Spinoza. Autograph.
44. BALFOUR, Arthur James to Mr. Yorke, 10th June 1903. Acknowledges a copy of a resolution passed at a political meeting. Autograph.
45. BALFOUR, Elizabeth Edith to Lady Battersea, expressing sympathy at the death of her mother, [September 1910(?)]. Autograph.
46. BALFOUR, Gerald William, 2nd Earl of Balfour to Lady Battersea, 6th January 1911. Replies to letter of sympathy on the death of a friend, "Butcher". Autograph.
47. BARNETT, Samuel Augustus to Mrs. Flower (later Lady Battersea), 8th September 1879. Expresses regret at the death of a relative. Autograph.
48. BENSON, E.F. to Lady Battersea, 31st November (no year). Expresses regret at the death of a relative.
49. BIRRELL, Augustine to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 18--. Gives news of his family. Autograph.
50. BROUGHTON, Rhoda to Lady Battersea, 16th June [19--]. Thanks her for her booklet on Lady de Rothschild. Autograph.
51. BRYCE, James, Viscount Bryce to Constance Flower (later Lady Battersea), 31st December 18--. Regrets being unable to respond to an invitation, and briefly discusses Irish problem. Autograph.

52. BUCKLE, George Earle to Lady Battersea, 17th August 1898. Thanks her for letter of sympathy on death of his wife. Autograph.
53. BUTLER, Henry Montagu to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 18th July 1885, on the writer's forthcoming resignation as headmaster of Harrow. Autograph.
54. CHOLMONDELEY, Mary to Lady Battersea, 29th December 1903. Discusses her latest book and family gossip. Autograph.
55. DELANE, John Thaddeus to Miss Annie de Rothschild (later Mrs. Eliot Yorke), 9th February 18---. Acknowledges a request. Autograph.
56. ESHER, Reginald Baliol Brett, 2nd Viscount Esher to "My dear friend", 30th December 1923. Contains an invitation to lunch. Autograph.
57. FARRAR, Frederick William to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 22nd February 18—on the surroundings of Westminster Abbey. Autograph.
58. GLADSTONE, William Ewart to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 10th October 1889. Covers an unspecified enclosure. Autograph.
59. HALDANE, Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 28th January 1891. Mentions some books on philosophy. Autograph.
60. HARCOURT, Sir Wililam George Granville Venables Vernon to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 13th April 1890. Discusses politics. Autograph.
61. HARRISON, Frederic to Lady Battersea, 22nd July 1918. Discusses a Somerset country house and its library, and his latest writings. Autograph.
62. HELPS, Sir Arthur to Miss Constance de Rothschild (later Lady Battersea), 19th December 1873. Sends review copy of his *Ivan de Biron*. Autograph.
63. HOPKINS, Jane Ellice to Lady Battersea, 18th February 1898. Asks for funds for temperance movement. Gives details of her state of health. Autograph.
64. ASQUITH, Herbert Henry to Lady Battersea, 24th April 1911. Acknowledges congratulations. Autograph.
65. PAUL, Herbert Woodfield to Lady Battersea, 22nd December 1908. Thanks her for gift. Autograph.

66. ROSEBERY, Archibald Philip Primrose, 5th Earl of Rosebery to Mrs. Eliot Yorke, 30th april 1885. Says he will pass on her views to Gladstone. Autograph.
67. SPENCER, John Poyntz, 5th Earl of Spencer to Cyril Flower (later Lord Battersea), 23rd December 1891. Declines an invitation. Autograph.
68. VILLIERS, Charles Pelham to Sir Anthony de Rothschild, 13th November [1877?]. Congratulates him on his daughter's marriage. Autograph.
69. WARD, Mary Augusta to Lady Battersea, 19th August 1912. Thanks her for present of book of extracts from the latter's mother's diaries. Autograph.
70. WOLSELEY, Garnet Joseph, Viscount Wolseley to Mr. Eliot Yorke, 9th March 18--. Arranges to dine before a lecture. Autograph.
71. HARRISON, Frederic to Sir Theodore Morison, 10th November 1888. Enquires when the latter's late father's legacy to the Committee of Newton Hall will be paid, and offer to help Morison with his career. Autograph.
72. HARRISON, Frederic to Sir Theodore Morison, 28th November 1888. Largely concerning legacy to Newton Hall. Autograph.
73. CHAMBERLAIN, Austen to Sir Theodore Morison, 13th August 1929. Discusses the Hague Conference and expresses doubt about Morison's intended resignation from the Principalship of Armstrong College. Autograph.
74. SMUTS, Jan Christian to Sir Theodore Morison, 28th January 1930. Advocates a South African candidate for a scholarship. Autograph.
75. CARLYLE, Thomas: Two letters to J. Cotter Morison, 2nd June 1862 and 6th January 1863, dealing with Morison's *Life and Times of St. Bernard*, which was dedicated to Carlyle. Autograph.
76. ARNOLD, Matthew: Letters to J. Cotter Morison, 21st October and 23rd October, with envelope postmarked 23rd October 1878. Deals with Morison's *Gibbon* (1878) and his proof that Arnold's suggestion that *The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire* was originally intended to have been written in French was incorrect. Autograph.
77. LOWELL, James Russell to J. Cotter Morison, 9th June 1880. Accepts invitation to dinner, and discusses the improvement in his wife's health. Autograph.

78. PATTISON, Mark to J. Cotter Morison, 3rd March 1881. Invites him to stay at Lincoln College. Autograph.
79. MORLEY, John, Viscount Morley to J. Cotter Morison, 18th September 1882. Discusses arrangements for printing Morison's *Macauley*. Fragment of another letter enclosed. Autograph.
80. TOYNBEE, Paget Jackson to J. Cotter Morison, 1st October 1882. Expresses regret at being unable to undertake work in Paris during the winter. Autograph.
81. STEPHEN, Sir Leslie to J. Cotter Morison, 23rd November 1882. Comments on Morison's *Macauley*. Autograph.
82. TREVELYAN, Sir George Otto to J. Cotter Morison, 24th November 1882. On Morison's *Macauley*. Invites him to breakfast to discuss the book. Autograph.
83. DICEY, Albert Venn to J. Cotter Morison, 24th November 1882. Comments on his *Macauley*. Autograph.
84. ROMANES, George J. to J. Cotter Morison, 17th January 1883. Alters date for lecture. Autograph.
85. SIDGWICK, Henry to J. Cotter Morison, 24th January 1883. Acknowledges Morison's relation to him of a psychic experience. Autograph.
86. COLVIN, Sir Sidney to J. Cotter Morison, 11th August 1884. Accepts invitation. Autograph.
87. JACKSON, Henry to J. Cotter Morison, 7th November 1884. Cancels a club dinner. Autograph.
88. JAMES, Henry to J. Cotter Morison, 21st April [188-]. Accepts dinner invitation. Autograph.
89. BESANT, Sir Walter to J. Cotter Morison, [188-]. On negotiations between authors and publishers. Autograph.
90. O'CONNOR, Thomas Power to J. Cotter Morison, "Tuesday" [188-]. On the Coercion question in Ireland. Autograph.
91. ELGIN, James Bruce, 8th Earl of Elgin and 12th Earl of Kincardine to Madame de Bury, 23rd August 1860. Describes his house in China and discusses Chinese military defences. Autograph.
92. ELGIN, James Bruce, 8th Earl of Elgin and 12th Earl of Kincardie to Madame de Bury, 12th January 1861. Written from Hong Kong. Comments on European affairs. Autograph.

93. SHELLEY, Mary to Rose Stuart (later Madame de Bury), 17th March 1844 and 14th October 1844. Asks her for historical information about Bohemia and comments on her own lack of knowledge of the German language. Arranges a visit. Autograph.
94. HOLLAND, C. to Madame de Bury, 18th February 1848. Comments on European affairs in general and Italian in particular, and gives particulars of an audience with Pope Pius IX. Autograph.
95. ARNOLD, Matthew to Madame de Bury, 7th February 1867, 17th March 1867 and 27th January 1868. Advises her on the publication of articles in periodicals and, in the last, mentions his fondness for her novels. Autograph.
96. ARNOLD, Matthew to Madame de Bury, 16th July [1862]. Regrets that he is unable to accept an invitation. Autograph.
97. ARNOLD, Matthew to Madame de Bury, postmarked 11th June 1881(?). Arranges an afternoon visit. Autograph.
98. KINGLAKE, Alexander to Madame de Bury: A collection of 13 letters, dated between 1860(?) and 15th October 1872. Sometimes amatory in tone, but with many comments on contemporary personalities and politics. Autograph.
99. AIREY, Richard, Baron Airey to A.W. Kinglake, 21st July 1860. Refuses Madame de Bury's request for the promotion of an officer in the Indian Army. Autograph.
100. CHAMBERS, Raymond Wilson to "Crawford", 22nd February 1931. On the text of Langland's *Piers Plowman*. Autograph.
101. REUTER, Paul Julius, Freiherr von to unidentified correspondent, 25th June 1868. Arranges a business meeting and sends a woodcut of Reuter. Autograph.
102. MURCHISON, Sir Roderick Impey to unidentified correspondent, 24th February 1842. Declines fossil specimens. Autograph.
103. BATEMAN, James to unidentified correspondent, 17th August 1846. Concerns a botanical specimen. Autograph.
104. BABINGTON, Charles Cardale to Sir W.J. Hooker, 25th October 1846. About a botanical specimen. Autograph.
105. BREWSTER, Sir David to Mr. or Mrs. Jackson, 30th March 1863. Encloses a ticket. Autograph.

106. GLAISHER, James to Rev. F. Silver, 3rd December 1868. On the forecasting of weather by farmers. Autograph.
107. GLAISHER, James: Two notes on meteorological subjects, 21st January 1861 and 26th December 1861. Also a note to the Rev. F. Silver, 20th March 1862 informing him that he has been elected a member of the British Meteorological Society. Autograph.
108. TURNET, Edward to Captain Alexander Maconochie, 15th January 1835. Arranges a lecture. Autograph.
109. SIMMONDS, Peter Lund to Mr. S.W.[?] Silver, 8th August 1877. On paintings and Japanese models for sale. Autograph.
110. WARD, Nathaniel Bagshaw to Rev. J.S. Henslow, 20th October 1836. On research into the growth of fungi. Autograph.
111. CHARLTON, Edward and HEATH, George Yeoman to Dr. R.M. Glover, 29th August 1851, protesting against the seizure of the major part of the museum of the old Newcastle School of Medicine and Surgery by one of the contesting groups in the “Disruption” of 1851. Autograph.
112. CAMPBELL, Colin to Joseph Cowen, 12th November 1885. Requests him to review his book on the Crofter Question in the *Newcastle Chronicle*. Autograph.
113. SARELL, Philip C. to Vaughan Williams, 18th July 1902, from Oriental Club, Hanover Square. About “Ostrorog’s book”, probably Leon Ostrorog’s 1901 translation of Ali Ibn Muhammed al Mawardi’s *El-Akham es-Soulthaniya*. Autograph.
114. Three letters in Arabic to Edward G. Browne from Subh-i-Ezel (marked “received 17th June 1896”), Abbas Effendi (12th May 1891) and Mirza Badi n’Nah (28th May 1891).
115. SHIPLEY, Orby to Joseph Cowen, 4th February 1894. Encloses second edition of book previously reviewed by Cowen. Autograph.
116. PHILIPSON, John to Her Royal highness The Princess Louise, Marchioness of Lorne, 13th November 1888, from “Atkinson & Philipson – by appointment to HRH Prince of Wales”. Encloses copy of book on “Harness Manufacture” accepted on the occasion of the opening of the Durham College of Science.
117. ARKLE, J. to Robert White, 24th June 1856. Encloses drawing of “the camp” for the volume “Otterburn”. Gives account of pranks of the “Borrowlow Bogle”. Autograph.

118. WALTON, David to Dr. Alex Carte, 24th November[?] 1859. Requests Capt. Young's address to facilitate delivery of his bear skin. Autograph.
119. PARSONS, Charles A. to Dr. G. Johnstone Stoney, 2nd June 1903. Typescript letter of testimony on Dr. Stoney's daughter's "very high and distinguished abilities in applied mathematics".
120. LUCAS, C.P. to Lord Grey of Fallodon, 16th February 1916. Comments on "The Institute and its Library". Autograph.
121. KEYNES, Geoffrey to Mr. Rose, 18th September 1950. Discusses Keynes' attendance at a meeting to give talk on editions of *Religio Medici*. Autograph.
122. KEYNES, Geoffrey to Mr. Rose, 31st October 1950. Thanks him for hospitality. Autograph.
123. KEYNES, Geoffrey to Mr. Rose, 17th January 1951. Declines invitation to Book Club meeting. Invites him to a forthcoming thymectomy at Barts. Typescript.
124. WEBB, Beatrice to J. Atkinson Hobson, 6th September 1920. Lengthy letter thanking Hobson for his criticisms of their scheme relating to political and social reforms. Typescript.
125. POOLE, R.L., editor of the *English Historical Review*, to A.G. Little, 3rd April 1915. Encloses copy of "Leach's book", together with some notes concerning it, including page of references. Autograph. (Leach's book is probably *The Schools of Medieval England* by Arthur Francis Leach, 1915.)
126. POOLE, R.L. to A.G. Little, 2nd May 1915. Gives advice on writing about Leach's work. Autograph.
127. HUNT, William to A.G. Little, 6th September 1915. Refutes allegations of scholarly errors made against him by Leach in his book on medieval schools. Autograph.
128. GRAHAM, Rose to A.G. Little, 19th May 1915. Discusses at length various points in Leach's book. Autograph.
129. GRAHAM, Rose to A.G. Little, 21st May 1915. Discusses various points in Leach's book. Autograph.
130. GRAHAM, Rose to A.G. Little, 21st June 1915. Discusses Little's review of Leach's book on Grammar Schools. Autograph.

131. HORSLEY, John (1685-1732): Two Latin scripts by John Horsley. Also related modern correspondence between Dr. T. Loveday (Banbury) and Dr. W.S. Mitchell (Librarian, Newcastle University), both dated January 1956.
132. PASQUIER, Etienne (1529-1615): Receipt dated 16th June 1601.
133. SELWYN, C.J., M.P.: Two autograph letters about the Religious Worship part of the 1851 Census (GPS-CEN-1851-B3). One from C.J. Selwyn, M.P. and one unidentified, both dated March 1860.
134. WALTER, Charles, secretary of the British Meteorological Society to Rev. Fred. Silver, 29th March 1862. Discusses visits, "Telegraph Fronts"[?] and a set of meteorological instruments. Autograph.
135. MEEKE, J.J. to Rev. Fred. Silver, 7th January 1871. Thanks him for the Almanacks. Autograph.
136. MEEKE, J.J. to S[?].W. Silver, 2nd June 1876. Letter of thanks. Autograph.
137. MEEKE, J.J. to S[?].W. Silver, 19th October 1877. Speaks of enclosed letter from Lord Godolphin Osborne. Autograph.
138. MEEKE, J.J. to S[?].W. Silver, 13th February 1878. Apologises for not being able to help "your case", but is "deeply pledged to Essex cases". Autograph.
139. TAYLOR, J.G., Royal Observatory to Captain Ross, 26th May 1828. Encloses computations for 9 inches (telescope?). Autograph.
140. NORTHAMPTON, Spencer Joshua Alwyne Carlton, 2nd Marquis (1790-1851) to unidentified recipient, 21st April 1845. Mentions Council of the Royal society (of which Northampton was President). Autograph.
141. GARDINER, William (1770-1853) to unidentified recipient, 14th December 1838. Relates how his sister's servant boy stole 160 music plates and sold them "for a trifle" to a Marine(?) store, who subsequently melted them down. Gardiner is so annoyed that he offered "the whole of my works for a home in town". Autograph.
142. CORY, Arthur to Joseph Cowen, 7th May 1882, from Lahore. Has asked his publisher to send Cowen a copy of his book (*The Eastern Menace*) brought out at the end of the previous year. Autograph.

143. DIXON, T. to Robert Spence Watson, 22nd August 1879. Sends copy of a passage in Max Muller's lectures and encloses press cutting of Leland's article on gypsies. Speaks of a bust of Browning and a medallion of Darwin by Thomas Woolner. Refers to Crawhall. Autograph.
144. WATSON, Robert Spence to Sir W.G. Armstrong, 17th April 1886. Autograph, marked "copy". Discusses various land purchases in connection with the College of Medicine.
145. GARNETT, William of Durham College of Science to Dr. G.Y. Heath, 11th May 1886. Discusses the College's withdrawal from negotiations for the purchase of Singleton House. Autograph.
146. GARIBALDI, G. to Mr. Isaac Crother, bookseller, St. Nicholas Square, 30th August 1859. Expresses thanks for his reception on Tyneside and gives his opinion of Louis Kossuth and Joseph Mazzini. Autograph.
147. SWAN, Sir J.W. to Mr. Worsnop, 9th November 1897. Concerns the lighting of Cragside, the first house to be lighted by the incandescent electric lamp. Autograph.
