The 5<sup>th</sup> Landscape Archaeology Conference will take place in Newcastle and Durham from the 17<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup> September 2018. We will be welcoming over 300 participants, from almost 40 countries and from a very wide range of disciplines concerned with the archaeological and environmental study of landscape, including archaeology, anthropology, environmental sciences, geography, geology, heritage, landscape architecture, landscape history and others. The Universities of Newcastle and Durham have almost a century-long tradition of archaeological research and teaching. Their own research interests spread across the world, but their 'local' region, north east England, is well worth visiting for its wealth of prehistoric remains and perhaps the best known of the Roman imperial frontiers. The region was one of the cradles of early Christianity in Britain and a birthplace of the Industrial Revolution; all in all, a perfect location for LAC2018.

Our calls for sessions and presentations was very successful and the conference will have 35 sessions running in nine parallel sessions over three days, 18-20<sup>th</sup> September, and our programme contains c 270 oral presentations and 35 posters. There will be half day excursions on 19<sup>th</sup> September, and a social programme:

#### Accommodation

Participants are responsible for arranging and funding their own accommodation at the conference. #### **Travel**

Participants will need to arrange their own travel to Newcastle. Newcastle is easily accessible by direct flights to Newcastle International Airport, with links to the city centre provided by the Metro (a local train service). Newcastle also benefits from direct train services from all major UK cities including London (3 hours), Edinburgh (1.5 hours) and Manchester (3 hours).

For the parts of the conference held in Durham, transport by coach will be provided to Durham on the morning of  $19^{th}$  September) and returning (whether via one of the organised excursions or ) back to Newcastle in the evening.
