ELIGIBILITY FOR THE PARTNERS PROGRAMME

The PARTNERS Programme is intended for able candidates who have the potential to succeed at Newcastle University. To be considered for the Programme a candidate's predicted grades must normally *match* the PARTNERS offer for the course.

Please note: the PARTNERS Programme Supported Entry Route is limited to students who are recognized as having 'home status'. A student's home status must have been confirmed by the Home Office *prior* to applying to the PARTNERS Programme.

SECTION A: AUTOMATIC ELIGIBILITY

If a candidate meets any **one** of the four criteria below, plus those listed above, they will be *provisionally* accepted onto the PARTNERS Programme. University staff will determine automatic eligibility from the candidate's personal details. CRITERIA

- (1) The candidate lives in a government-defined Low Participation Neighbourhood, as indicated by their individual home postcode.
- (2) *The candidate has attended a school at age 16 where the number of students achieving 5 or more GCSE grades A* to C, including English and Mathematics, is 30% or less.
- (3) *The candidate currently attends a school where the average QCA points score per student is less than 503.2 or less of the National Average.
- (4) The candidate is currently in receipt of Free School Meals and/or Education Maintenance Allowance/Adult Learning Grant.

**Note: school performance data for GCSE and post-16 are those quoted by the DCSF for 2008. Please contact the Student Recruitment Team to find out if your school/college meets these criteria.*

Please note: the PARTNERS Programme Supported Entry Route is limited to students who are recognised as having 'home status'. Your home status must have been confirmed by the Home Office prior to applying to the PARTNERS Programme.

<p>1. Contact the Student Recruitment Team to discuss whether you are eligible to apply to the Programme.</p>	<p>Make sure you do this at an early stage! Telephone: 0191 222 6094 E-mail: partners@ncl.ac.uk</p>
<p>2. If you are eligible for the Programme, complete the PARTNERS Programme Application Form (PAGE 1).</p>	<p>Make sure you complete all sections of the form. Both you and your parent/carer (if applicable) must sign the form.</p>
<p>3. Complete your UCAS form in the usual way. In addition, enter a capital 'P' for the PARTNERS degree programme(s) you wish to apply to in the 'Further details' section of the UCAS form.</p>	<p>Applying for a PARTNERS offer will not affect your applications to other universities. The 'P' on the form will enable our admissions staff to identify you as a PARTNERS Programme candidate once your application is received by Newcastle University. You can apply to up to five courses at Newcastle University through the PARTNERS Programme.</p>
<p>4. Give your PARTNERS Programme Application Form and a copy of your UCAS form to your teacher/tutor so that they can complete the reference and send the form to us.</p> <p>The deadlines are: 15 October 2009 for applications to Medicine and Dentistry. 15 January 2010 for all other applications.</p>	<p>The person to give your form to will normally be the person who completes your UCAS reference, or the named PARTNERS contact teacher/tutor for your school or college. To check who that is, call us on 0191 222 6094, or e-mail partners@ncl.ac.uk</p> <p>Please ensure your teacher/tutor sends us your form straight away to avoid any delay in your application.</p>
<p>5. The Student Recruitment Team will consider your form and make a decision as to whether you will be provisionally accepted onto the Programme. We will write to you to tell you whether or not you have been provisionally accepted.</p>	<p>If you are not accepted onto the PARTNERS Programme, you may still be eligible for a typical offer under the Newcastle Guaranteed Offer Scheme. Full details are given in the PARTNERS brochure, or on the PARTNERS website www.ncl.ac.uk/partners</p>
<p>6. If you are provisionally accepted, your UCAS form will then be considered by admissions staff in the relevant subject area(s). They will make the final decision as to whether to make you a PARTNERS offer.</p> <p>If we make an offer, the offer will include successful completion of the Assessed Summer School and this will mean that you have been formally accepted onto the PARTNERS Programme.</p>	<p>PLEASE NOTE: in order to take advantage of the PARTNERS offer, you must make the PARTNERS offer your firm choice/CF through UCAS. You may only make the PARTNERS offer your insurance choice/CI if your CF choice is for a course at Newcastle University that is currently not participating in the PARTNERS Programme.</p>
<p>7. You will then be invited to attend a finance information evening, a pre-Summer School tutorial and the PARTNERS Assessed Summer School. You must attend 100% of the Assessed Summer School (5–16 July 2010) and complete and submit the assessed project work.</p>	<p>You must be available for the duration of the Summer School and we would strongly advise you to be available after the Summer School to enable you to complete the assessed project work. The deadline for submission of assessed work is 27 July 2010.</p>

<p>1. Once you receive a student's PARTNERS Application Form, check that it has been completed correctly.</p>	<p>Please check that the student has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • included their postcode in their home address • completed all three sections of the form • made sure that they, and their parent/carer (if applicable), have signed and dated the form
<p>2. You/an appropriate colleague are asked to complete the confidential reference form (PAGE 2) indicating why the student is a suitable candidate for the PARTNERS Programme, and ensure predicted grades are provided.</p> <p>Detailed information on the criteria used to decide provisional acceptance onto the PARTNERS Programme are given on the confidential reference form (PAGE 2).</p>	<p>We appreciate that colleagues in schools and colleges may not have access to some of the information asked for in respect of the individual circumstances of some students. The eligibility factors listed in Section B, PAGE 2, are not exhaustive, but are intended as an indicative set of criteria. We would encourage you to provide further information and make as strong a case as possible for each student. Where a student is not eligible on the basis of the automatic criteria listed in Section A, PAGE 2, the candidate will be assessed on a weighting system on the basis of the information you provide.</p>
<p>3. Once completed, the confidential reference must be signed and dated. Please note that the information provided on the reference form will be entirely confidential to the school/college and to the University.</p>	<p>The information will only be disclosed to members of academic staff in cases where it is felt to be of benefit to the student concerned and only in agreement with the student. We will contact the relevant referee if any additional information is required.</p>
<p>4. The PARTNERS Programme Application Form must be submitted with a copy of the student's UCAS form. Please check that their UCAS form has been completed correctly, and that their predicted grades and reference are included.</p>	<p>Students are required to enter a capital 'P' for the PARTNERS degree programme(s) to which they are applying in the 'Further details' section of their UCAS form.</p>
<p>5. Once the above actions have been taken, send the PARTNERS Application Form, together with a copy of the completed UCAS application form, to the Student Recruitment Team at the address below. The forms must be submitted before 15 October 2009 for applicants to Medicine and Dentistry, and by 15 January 2010 for all other applicants.</p>	<p>Once we receive the application, we will follow the process set out in PAGE 3. Each application form will be considered against the criteria for acceptance onto the Programme and students will be notified of the outcome of this process within 10 days of receipt of the form by the University.</p>
