Notes

- (i) *These programme regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's Undergraduate Progress Regulations and Examination Conventions.*
- (ii) *All optional modules are offered subject to the constraints of the timetable and to any restrictions on the number of students who may be taught on a particular module. Not all modules may be offered in all years and they are listed subject to availability.*
- (iii) *A compulsory module is a module which a student is required to study.*
- (iv) *A core module is a module which a student must pass, and in which a fail mark may neither be carried nor compensated; such modules are designated by the board of studies as essential for progression to a further stage of the programme or for study in a further module.*
- (v) *The selection of modules at each Stage is subject to the approval of the Degree Programme Director, and timetable constraints. Candidates are normally expected to take non-CSC modules to a credit value of 40 at each Stage, with a maximum of 60 credits at level 4 over 3 years. Furthermore, all students must take a minimum of 90 credits at each Stage that are at the level of that Stage or higher, and a maximum of 40 level 4 credits can be taken over Stages 2 and 3.*
- (vi) *Programmes G5N4/G5NK are suspended for new entrants from September 2010.*

3. Intercalating Year

Upon completion of Stage 2 and before entering Stage 3, all candidates for “(Industrial Placement)” degrees shall spend the equivalent of one academic year in a placement approved by the Degree Programme Director. A Placement shall normally allow the candidate to gain experience in the use of Information Systems in a field appropriate to their degree, such as business, management or accounting. If the candidate is not successful in securing an approved placement, or fails the assessment of the placement year, then the candidate will be required to transfer to Stage 3 of the corresponding programme without “(Industrial Placement)”.
