Statement of Standards for MA Urban Design

All graduates will have gained a range of key skills in terms of the visual and written communication of design; interpersonal communication; group and interdisciplinary work; oral presentation; planning and organising; problem solving; initiative; adaptability; and computer literacy and computer aided design. They will also have acquired the independent learning ability required for life-long learning.

Graduate awarded a pass will have demonstrated at least a good knowledge and understanding of; urban design at an advanced level; the concepts, methods and techniques used to advance scholarship in urban design and how such concepts, methods and techniques are applied to create and interpret knowledge in urban design. In particular they will have a good understanding of the connections between urban design theory and practice and the values and ethics of working as a professional in the field of urban design. They be will capable of critically evaluating current research, an advanced scholarship in urban design and a good ability to apply the above in original ways in their own research and/or advanced design work.

Graduate awarded a merit will have demonstrated at least a very good knowledge and understanding; skills and abilities in a majority of the outcomes set out above.

Graduates awarded a distinction will have demonstrated excellence in knowledge and understanding; skills and abilities in a majority of the outcomes set out above.
