

Simple Profiles – Inspirational Alumni

Simple profiles can be used to **provide a small amount of information about a person or topic** which **displays as a list** on a page. This simple profile can also link through to a page of further information if required. See for example the [Venues on Campus](#) page:

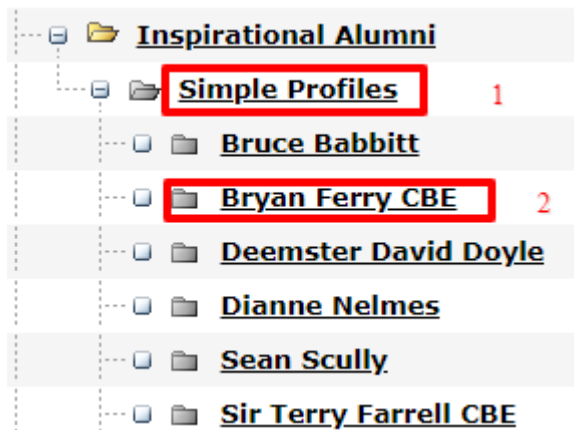

The setup in T4:



1. The **short profile** which displays in the Inspirational Alumni page **sits in the hidden section called 'Simple Profiles'** (see 1 above). **To add a short profile to this section use the content type '05. Profile Box'.**

Populate this content type with a **title**, some **content** and **image**. The required image size is 456px x 456px.

This content should also contain a 'Section link' to the full profile page, if one has been setup.

Alphabetical Order: the new Simple Profile will appear at the bottom of the list of Profiles in T4. To place the profile in the required order on the page **click the Placement tab** found within the content type to reorder the profile:

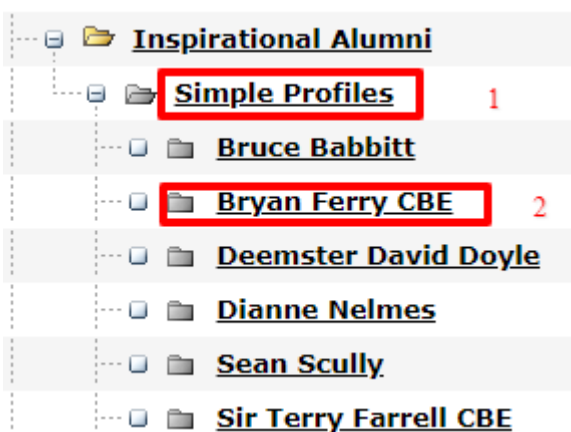

To **reposition the Profile** in the list, **scroll to the new position** then **click the button** to the right of the blank field. Select 'Update' and 'Approve' to save the change.

The Simple Profile, when 'Approved', automatically displays on the Inspirational Alumni page.

- The **full profile page** should be setup as a new section under the Simple Profiles section (see 2 - Bryan Ferry).



When 'adding the new section': fill in the Name field, leave the **Output URI field blank** and **uncheck** 'Show in Navigation'.

Add to this new section a **Page Title and Intro**, and a **General Purpose Paragraph** containing full bio and an image:

Bryan Ferry CBE

Singer songwriter (BA Fine Art 1968, Hon DMus 2014)

Born in 1945 in County Durham, Bryan Ferry is an artist and musician who studied Fine Art at The University of Newcastle, graduating in 1968.

He said: 'My four years at Newcastle University Fine Art Department were crucial in my development as an artist and musician.

While I was there, studying under the great Richard Hamilton, I met many like-minded students who became friends for life.'

Four years after he graduated, Ferry's band Roxy Music emerged and became one of the most influential bands of the 1970s. They produced eight classic albums including For Your Pleasure and Avalon and their legacy on popular music is still being heard today.

As a solo artist he has released a number of critically acclaimed and highly influential albums from These Foolish Things in 1973 to The Jazz Age in 2012.

Bryan Ferry has conceived and directed some of the most original, controversial and critically applauded album artwork of the last four decades.

In 2011 he was awarded the CBE, and in the same year the French Government made him an Officer of the Legion of Honour in the Order of Arts and Letters.

In 2014, Mr Ferry was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Music degree by Newcastle University.
