News

Remission of Type 2 diabetes after dietary intervention

These findings come from the DiRECT Study - a project funded by Diabetes UK and led by Professor Roy Taylor (Newcastle University) and Professor Mike Lean (Glasgow University).



Professor John Mathers, Professor Ashley Adamson and Alison Barnes are members of the DiRECT Study team. Working with

diabetic patients in primary care, the DiRECT study showed that 86% of participants who lost at least 15kg body weight achieved remission to a non-diabetic state. The results from this study have been published in The Lancet and full details can be found here.

Development of the MapMe intervention body image scales of known weight status for 4-5 and 10-11 year old children.

Members of the public health nutrition team have recently had their work on the development of body image scales of known weight status for 4-5 and 10-11 year old children published in the Journal of Public Health $\frac{https://academic.oup.com/jpubhealth/advance-article/doi/10.1093/pubmed/fdx129/4668752$.

The scales have recently been tested in a large trial, as part of an intervention to investigate ways of helping parents make better judgements of their child's weight status and to prompt action at an early stage. Research shows that many parents with an overweight child do not identify when their child has an unhealthy weight, and so may not make appropriate changes to their child's lifestyle or seek support. Nearly 3000 families with 4-5 and 10-11 year old children joined the study, from 15 regions across England. The trial collected data on parental ability to correctly categorise their child's weight status. Height and weight information was collected from over 2300 children 12 months post –intervention to examine the efficacy of the

intervention on longer term child weight outcomes. More detailed results will be the topic of a feature in a future newsletter, so watch this space!!!


HNRC Successes

Invited lectures at Events/Conferences

ISENC Conference – 19-21 December 2017 - Newcastle University hosted the very successful International Sport and Exercise Nutrition Conference. The conference attracted more than 300 delegates from over 20 countries. Delegates heard from nutrition experts on a range of topic areas including periodised nutrition for athletes, gut health, liver glycogen metabolism, the



health benefits of beetroot juice and the impact of nutrition and exercise on ageing and cell signalling. Three HNRC members, Professor Emma Stevenson, Professor John Mathers and Dr Emma Foster presented in symposium sessions at the conference.

The highlight of the conference was a Q&A session with Sir Chris Hoy on his career and the role of sport and exercise science and nutrition in his successes to date. We hope that all delegates and speakers enjoyed their time at Newcastle University.

Prof Emma Stevenson was also invited to speak at:

- Food Matters Live November 2017 presentation title 'protein for life: towards a focussed dietary framework for healthy ageing'.
- British Association of Sport and Exercise Science November 2017 presentation title 'Nutrition, exercise and appetite: hungry for more'.

Prof John Mathers was invited as a Plenary Speaker at the Korean Nutrition Society's 50th Annual Meeting in November 2017, in Seoul. His presentation was entitled: 'Obesity and bowel cancer: from molecular mechanisms to interventions'.

Dr Daniel West was invited to speak at the International Whey Conference, Chicago, in September 2017. His presentation title was 'Dairy protein and type 2 diabetes: what do we know?'

Tom Hill was invited as a co-editor to the Nutrition Society textbook 'Introduction to Human Nutrition' which is the best performing textbook in the Society's Textbook Series with over 17,500 sales to date across the first and second edition. The textbook is guided by Editor-in-Chief, Professor Susan Lanham-New, and has been widely adopted by nutrition courses throughout the world with translations into Spanish, Portuguese, French and Indonesian.

PhD Successes

Research on Musculoskeletal Ageing (CIMA) undertook research on "The effect of vitamin D and physical activity on knee osteoarthritis symptoms in older obese adults: a mixed methods study" supervised by Prof John Mathers, Dr Nicola O'Brien, Dr Leah Avery and Dr Daniel Cuthbertson of Liverpool University. Becky has defended her PhD thesis successfully and is now working on evidence synthesis and horizon scanning within the NIHR Innovation Observatory.

Nieka Wahono (supervised by Dr Ruth Valentine) successfully defended her PhD in 'Deciduous teeth as a tool to record early life exposure of zinc nutrition'. She returned to Indonesia in January, but we hope to continue to work together.

Azizah Mat Hussin (supervised by Dr Mario Siervo, Dr Tom Hill and Prof John Mathers) defended her PhD thesis successfully in late October, and has returned to her university post in Malaysia.

Nuno Mendonca (supervised by Dr Tom Hill, Prof Chris Seal and Prof Carol Jagger) successfully defended his PhD thesis titled 'Micronutrients and health in the very old: Analysis of the Newcastle 85+ Study' in early October. Nuno has published 5 peer reviewed papers as part of his PhD and was nominated for a Faculty Doctoral Thesis prize by his external examiners. He was also selected to participate in the upcoming ENLP programme in Luxembourg in April. Nuno is now working as a Research Assistant in the Institute of Health & Society.

Dr Susanna Mills passed her viva in early November 2017. The graduation ceremony was held on Thursday 7 December. Dr Mills was also successful in being appointed to an NIHR Clinical Lectureship a few days before.
