Learning Outcomes

After completing the programme, students will be able to:

1. **Research** and **identify options** regarding higher education and justify their reasoning.
2. **Understand how to assess** the **most appropriate route**, course and institution to suit their personal preference.
3. **Identify** and **articulate** the appropriate **transferable skills** (academic and practical) required for their university application.
4. Be able to **identify personal preferences** regarding study styles and use this in their progression planning (goal setting).
5. **Plan** and **identify personal strategies** to **maximise success** in upcoming assessments
