

Newcastle University – EU facts and figures

Staff and students from the EU are a vital part of our University community and we value the contribution they make across our academic schools and services.

Students

- There are 1,798 EU students at Newcastle University, representing 6% of all undergraduate students, and 11% of all postgraduate taught (PGT) students and 13% of postgraduate research (PGR) students at our University.
- First-year EU students (on undergraduate and postgraduate courses) account for:
 - 29% of Modern Languages students
 - 19% of Marine Sciences and Technology students
 - 15% of Computer Sciences students
 - 14% of students in Newcastle University Business School
 - 12% of Civil Engineering students
 - 10% of Law students
 - 6% of Electrical and Electronic engineering students
- EU students help ensure the long-term sustainability of postgraduate courses, particularly in higher-cost disciplines where they are highly represented in these subjects, ensuring they can continue to be offered to home students. First-year EU postgraduate research students at Newcastle University account for:
 - 19% of Mathematics students
 - 18% of Physical Sciences (Chemistry) students
 - 21% of Computer Sciences students
- EU graduates from first degrees at Newcastle are twice as likely to go on to further study as UK graduates and 81% of those who pursue further study choose to remain in the UK to do so.

Staff

- There are around 642 members of staff from other EU countries at our University. They make up 11% of the overall workforce, 16% of academics and 24% of staff on research-only contracts. 87% of our EU staff work in highly skilled professional, managerial and technical roles.
- EU staff are a vital part of our community, bringing expertise and skills to the University. In the John Walton Muscular Dystrophy Research Centre alone, almost one third of staff are from the EU.

- EU academics are particularly prominent in certain Schools, including: Agriculture, Food & Rural Development (5%); Civil Engineering & Geosciences (5%); Computing Science (5%); Modern Languages (6%); Newcastle University Business School (12%); Medical School (ICMB, ICM, IGM, IHS & ION) (17%).
- The table below shows the countries from which EU staff come to work at Newcastle University.
