

Biomedical and Biomolecular Sciences

Transfer to Medicine or Dentistry

All applicants who are successful in securing a place on our Biomedical and Biomolecular Science degree programmes are eligible to apply to transfer to Medicine or Dentistry after their first year of study.

- Students will be selected in their first year, based on their UCAT score, a personal statement, their first year performance and, if shortlisted, an interview.
- Transfer is into the first year of the Medicine or Dentistry course the following academic year. A lecture timetabled in the first semester of first year will provide further information regarding the transfer schemes and the application process.

Transfer to Medicine

- The MBBS Medicine and Surgery programme is led by the School of Medicine.
- Up to 7 places available via the transfer scheme.
- Academic requirements: a minimum average mark of 75% across the 1st year modules, with no less than 65% in any one module.




• In 2022-23, 44 students applied to transfer to Medicine, of which 9 were interviewed and 7 offers were made subject to semester 2 exam results.

Transfer to Dentistry

- The BDS Dental Surgery degree programme is led by the School of Dental Sciences.
- Up to 2 places available via the transfer scheme.
- Academic requirements: a minimum average mark of 75% across the 1st year modules, with no less than 65% in any one module.

Applicants need to provide evidence of a personal UCAT score achieved within 2 years of commencing their Bioscience programme on application to the MBBS or BDS transfer scheme (i.e. UCAT taken in 2022 or 2023),
