The Borderlands area:

- The Borderlands covers five authorities in southern Scotland and northern England
- Predominately rural with a larger urban centre in the city of Carlisle
- Shared opportunities and challenges to increase productivity, the working age population and achieve inclusive growth.















Shared Challenges



- Economic challenges
 - Low productivity
 - GVA per head 31% lower that UK average
 - Declining working age population
 - 4% fall since 2011
 - Further 5% decrease by 2039
 - Need to deliver inclusive growth
 - Digital exclusion: 4G services unavailable to 40% of households
 - Earnings in Borderlands are amongst the lowest in the UK
 - Area is a recognised 'cold-spot' for access to higher education



Borderlands timetable:

- The Partnership has been working together since 2014.
- Proposition (2017) and Proposal (2018) submitted to Scottish and UK Governments





Borderlands Inclusive Growth Deal:

- Unique cross-border and largely rural Deal with £450m investment
- Will deliver around 5,500 job opportunities, attract four million more tourisms and generate £1.1bn additional GVA.
