## First Year Students: Semester One Reading Lists

If you are taking a **Language and Linguistics** degree with us, please see the *English Language* and *Linguistics Indicative Texts Stage 1* document (found on the same webpage as this document) for an outline of your reading.

If you are taking a Literature degree with us, you will be taking one or both of the two core modules, SEL1030 *Close Reading* and SEL1003 *Introduction to Literary Studies*:

- Close Reading has no required reading; in order to prepare for it, we suggest that you read something very different to the kind of text you usually read.
- Introduction to Literary Studies is where you will be exploring a new text each week.
   This coming autumn, these texts will include (amongst others) Brian Friel's
   Translations, Jackie Kay's The Adoption Papers, Emily Brontë's Wuthering Heights
   and Sam Selvon's The Lonely Londoners. You may wish to get started on this reading in advance of the semester, although there is no need to do so.
