Refurbishment

History

The Gallery is collocated with Fine Art in the King Edward VII Building at the heart of the University campus. The Hatton Gallery, founded in 1925, is named after Professor Richard George Hatton, head of the King Edward VII School of Fine Art, Armstrong College and later the Head of the Fine Art School, Newcastle University.

Refurbishment

A £2.1million award from the Heritage Lottery Fund, along with other grants and donations, will contribute towards this joint project between Newcastle University and Tyne and Wear Archives and Museums.

The project will enhance the important historic features of the building while improving the environmental conditions to ensure the collection and art works on display are safeguarded for future generations to enjoy. The building layout will be modified to improve the visitor and student experience creating improved public access and a dedicated learning zone which will offer high-quality teaching space alongside the upgraded galleries.

Further Information

The Hatton Gallery is expected to re-open in Autumn 2017.
