National Student Survey 2025

Key results:

- Scores have increased across all themes, but benchmarks in all themes have increased more, leaving us in a weaker position re: TEF.
- Below benchmark for 5 of 7 themes significantly below benchmark (>2.5%) in four themes Teaching on my course (-2.9%), Learning Opportunities (-3.8%), Assessment and Feedback (-6.4%), Student Voice (-4.6%)
- Above benchmark for Learning Resources (by 1.2%) and Academic Support (by 0.1%)
- Russell Group ranking has fallen for all themes
- Bottom of the Russell Group ranking for Teaching on my course, and 23rd of 24th for Learning Opportunities.

Postgraduate Taught Experience Survey 2025

Key results:

- Newcastle positivity scores are **above** sector benchmark for 8 of 12 themes, significantly above benchmark (>2.5%) for Support (+3.3%) and On-Campus Resources (+3.2%); for both themes Newcastle is in the first quartile
- Scores are below sector benchmark for 4 of 12 themes End-point Assessment (-15.4%) (please note that this question theme was available to apprenticeship programmes only), Dissertation (-1.5%), Assessment (-1.0%) and Overall (-0.5%)
- In Russell Group, Newcastle is above benchmark for 11 of 12 themes, significantly above benchmark (>2.5%) for 4 themes Support (+3.7%), Community (+3.1%), On-Campus Resources (+2.8%), Assessment (+2.7%), being in the first quartile for Support, On-Campus Resources and Skills Development
