Field trips Tuesday 19 September

The Castle, Newcastle

This trip will introduce you to the history of the 12th century Norman fortress which commands dramatic views over the city and the River Tyne. Although threatened by demolition from railway interests in the 1840s (a viaduct now runs through the site), the Castle has become a symbol of Newcastle and its layered past.

This trip is a guided tour of the Castle, taking in the dungeon, chapel, and prison. For many visitors, the highlight is the view of Newcastle and Gateshead from the roof of the Keep.
