May, 1825.</p> <p>{ Charged upon the Oath of Robert Hill, of North Shields, Mariner, with suspicion of feloniously stealing, taking, and carrying away, three Suits of Clothes, one Watch, with Ribbons, Seal, and Key, six Silver Spoons, two Waistcoats, one Umbrella, two Pairs of Pantaloon, one Pair of Boots, one Silk Handkerchief, one Brass Box, and various other Articles, in the Dwelling House of the said Robert Hill, in the Parish of Tynemouth, in the said County, on the 6th. day of May, now last past. Committed 8th. June, 1825.</p> <p>{ Charged upon the Oaths of Thomas Charlton, Thomas Dooids, John Clark, and Eleanor Gordon, that he, the said Robert Oliver, did, on the 30th. day of April last, with a certain false, forged, and counterfeited Promissory Note, which he held in both his hands, assault, beat, and wound, the said John Clark, upon the head, and by that means did give him a dangerous wound of the length of three inches and half an inch, whereby the life of the said John Clark was greatly despaired of. Committed 19th. July, 1825.</p> <p>{ Singlewoman, charged on the Oath of Catharine Burdon, Widow, and Others, with having on the fourteenth day of July instant, feloniously stolen, taken, and carried away, four Yards of Lustrre, of the value of Five Shillings, one Pillow Slip, of the value of One Shilling, three Printed Books, of the value of Two Shillings, and one Brooch, of the value of Ten Shillings, the Property of the said Catharine Burdon. Sentenced to Death, but afterwards respited during His Majesty's Pleasure.</p> <p>{ Labourer, having been tried for Larceny at the last Northumberland Midsummer Sessions, and found guilty.
