Aims

To allow students to demonstrate their potential to succeed in specified degree programmes by showing a grasp of entry-level subject-specific knowledge, understanding, cognitive and subject-specific skills.

Learning Outcomes

A good knowledge and understanding of ...

• The summer school in Fine Art will focus on climate aware art practices, art historical responses and sustainable ways of making. This is part of the key priority in the department and recent Future Climate event (see link) dealing with the role artists play in the current climate emergency.

The ability to apply this knowledge and critical understanding to...

- Applicants will learn about other artists working in this context, they will
 experiment in a practice workshop sustainable approaches to making and
 discussing key themes around the sustainable making.
 Students will be assessed on their creations during the in-person workshops
 they complete on campus by responding to relevant theoretical frameworks.
- The second way students will be assessed is by answering set questions based on the online materials they have been engaging with.
- The final way students will be assessed is through self-evaluation of how they will apply some of the practices they have learnt about when they start university.

- Development of practical artistic skills (practice-based research)
- Ability to contextualise work of art

- Become more aware of current artists working in the research context
- Preparation to start the academic course at university
