Summer School Syllabus

On-campus sessions:

MONDAY

Lecture: Introduction to English Language & Linguistics

Lecture + Practical Session: Phonology

-Purpose/Objective: to become familiar to basic questions that students will encounter in Stage 1 phonology (SEL1027) as well as practice recognizing and using scientific notations required for this field of study.

Lecture + Practical Session: Morphology

-Purpose/Objective: to become familiar to basic questions that students will encounter in Stage 1 morphology (SEL1027) as well as practice recognizing and using scientific notations required for this field of study.
