Activities for Personal Study

In order to introduce students to the learning process at University the first day will include a personal study session to prepare for a 'seminar' style session. Students will be set the chapter 'The Nature and Variety of Historical Sources' in Anthony Brundage, Going to the Sources: A Guide to Historical Research and Writing (Hoboken, NJ: John Wiley & Sons, 2017), 15-30.

During the Tuesday session 'Introduction to Historical Sources' this will include a mix of mini-lectures with reflective activities based on the lecture material.

Following the 'Working with Historical Sources' session, the students will explore the sources and archives discussed there further, work which will inform their assessment. They will have time to work on their assessed source analysis.
