 The students will apply their learning and critical understanding to a range of musical pieces, both classical, traditional, and popular/vernacular' using selected examples drawn from the literature of historical, cultural and analytical studies of music.

• The ability to evaluate historical, critical, and analytical judgments, distinguish between fact and opinion in these areas and assess historical, cultural and analytical data and use it to construct a reasoned argument. This will demonstrate competence in describing musical processes using both aural and notated evidences, using appropriate technical musical vocabulary and deploying appropriate terminologies from the historical and cultural study of music.
