

Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarships

Newcastle University offers a large number of partial scholarship awards to assist EU students to study for an undergraduate degree. The awards are available for the full duration of the student's study and will be credited to the student's fee account to reduce the overall cost of tuition fees.

Terms and Conditions

- To be considered for awards, applicants must have applied through UCAS to study as an undergraduate and must have been offered a place to study on their chosen degree programme at the University's Newcastle city centre campus for the 2023/24 academic year.
- Eligible applicants will be considered automatically for awards based on their programme application to study at Newcastle University.
- To be considered for awards applicants must be domiciled in an EU member state for other than study and tourism purposes and must be classed as international for tuition fee purposes. EU applicants domiciled in the UK who qualify for international fees will also be considered. Applicants domiciled in EEA member states that are not part of the EU are not eligible.
- The value of the awards by academic school is stated below:

School of Architecture, Planning and Landscape	40% of the international fee
School of Arts and Cultures	35% or 40% of the international fee
Newcastle University Business School	35% of the international fee
School of Combined Honours and Philosophical Studies	35% of the international fee
School of Education, Communication and Language Sciences	35% or 40% of the international fee
School of English Literature, Language and Linguistics	35% of the international fee
School of Geography, Politics and Sociology	35% or 40% of the international fee
School of History, Classics and Archaeology	35% or 40% of the international fee
School of Modern Languages	35% of the international fee
Newcastle Law School	35% of the international fee
School of Computing	45% of the international fee
School of Engineering	45% of the international fee
School of Mathematics, Statistics and Physics	35%, 40% or 45% of the international fee
School of Natural and Environmental Sciences	45% of the international fee
School of Biomedical, Nutritional and Sports Sciences	45% of the international fee
School of Pharmacy	45% of the international fee
School of Psychology	45% of the international fee

The value of the scholarships for stage 2 and 3 entry students may differ, but the percentage amount will stay the same (see point 12 below)

- The awards will be credited to the student's tuition fee account and will be renewable annually, subject to academic progression.
- To receive awards applicants must become registered students at Newcastle University in the 2023/24 academic year for a full-time, award-bearing undergraduate programme. Awards cannot be deferred to later academic years.
- Fully sponsored students do not qualify for these awards. A fully-funded scholarship or full sponsorship covers fees and maintenance. The University reserves the right to suspend payment and recover any scholarship amounts already made to students with full funding.
- Scholarships will not be confirmed unless applicants satisfy all conditions related to their scholarship offer.
- Successful applicants cannot be in receipt a Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarship award AND an award from any of the following scholarship schemes operated by the University: any Elite Sports Scholarships, International Family Discount, Alumni Tuition Fee Discount, faculty and school scholarships, Vice-Chancellor's INTO Scholarships, Newcastle University Joint Venture Scholarships. Applicants may apply for and/or be considered for more than one award but if successful in the Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarship and one of the schemes listed then they would receive the Higher of the awards with the lower value award reallocated to another applicant. The list of schemes

is not exhaustive and applicants should check the regulations for all funding opportunities to which they apply to ensure eligibility.

10. For students on placements, the scholarship will be applied to the reduced tuition fee payable in the placement year. Students studying Business, Accounting and Finance (with placement) will receive the Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarship on a pro rata basis in years 2, 3 and 4.
11. Student applying through UCAS to begin study at Newcastle in year 2 of their degree programme are eligible for the scholarship.
12. The following applicants are not eligible to receive Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarship awards:
 - Applicants for MB BS, BDS, BSc Hons Oral and Dental Health Sciences and PGCE courses
 - Current students, registered at the University, who have already commenced their undergraduate degree at the time of the award. Awards cannot be made retrospectively
 - Applicants initially assessed as international for fee purposes but whose fees change to "home" (due to receiving settled status, pre-settled status or other reasons)
 - Students repeating courses
 - Intercalating students
 - Study abroad, occasional and exchange students
 - Part-time students
13. Students on multi-year, undergraduate degree programmes will receive the same scholarship value (i.e. 50% of the international fee) for the whole duration of the degree programme. The value of the scholarship will not increase in line with the tuition fee increases in years 2, 3 and 4 of the degree programme.
14. The University reserves the right to vary all or any scholarship awards at its sole discretion.
15. The University's decision on all Vice-Chancellor's EU Scholarship awards and interpretation of rules and regulations shall be final: appeals will not be considered.
