

Vice-Chancellor's Global Scholarships (VCGS)

Newcastle University offers partial scholarship awards to encourage well-qualified applicants assessed as international for fees purposes to undertake undergraduate study. Each award is worth £4,000 for the full duration of the student's degree programme and is payable to the student's tuition fee account

Terms and Conditions

1. An applicant can only apply for and be considered for a scholarship after they have been offered a place to study on their chosen eligible undergraduate degree programme at the University's Newcastle city centre campus for the 2023/24 academic year and have been assessed as international for fees purposes. **Applications cannot be considered in advance of applicants meeting these two criteria.** Postgraduate taught, study abroad, research degree applicants and exchange students are not eligible to apply for awards. Applicants for Medicine MB BS and Dental Surgery BDS courses are not eligible to apply for awards.
2. Applicants domiciled in the following countries **are not eligible** to apply for VCGS awards as the University offers specific schemes for these countries: : India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia, South Africa, Tanzania, Thailand, Turkey, the USA, Vietnam and the EU. Applicants domiciled in all other countries are eligible.
3. The closing date for applications is 27th April 2023: late applications will not be considered.
4. The University awards Scholarships on the basis of academic merit and other information provided on the Scholarship application form. To be considered for awards applicants must have or expect to receive a minimum of ABB at A level or equivalent. The applicants chosen to receive the awards will be assessed according to evidence of academic ability, evidence of commitment to studies and quality of application and may be contacted for additional information.
5. Scholarships are renewable annually and will be subject to academic progression.
6. Current undergraduate students, already registered at the University, are not eligible to apply for awards.
7. 2023/24 awards cannot be deferred until the 2024/25 academic year.
8. The value of the scholarships will be £4,000 and will be credited to the student's tuition fee account to reduce the overall cost of tuition fees. Students who pay reduced fees due to being on placement will receive the VCGS on a pro-rata basis.
9. Successful applicants cannot be in receipt of a VCGS award AND an award from any of the following scholarship schemes operated by the University: Newcastle University GREAT Scholarships, any Elite Sports Scholarships;, scholarships offered by schools and faculties, the Alumni Tuition Fee Discount, International Family Discount, Vice-Chancellor's INTO Scholarships, Newcastle University Foundation Scholarships. Applicants may apply for and/or be considered for more than one award but if successful in the VCGS and one of the schemes listed then they would receive the Higher of the awards with the lower value award reallocated to another applicant. Students whose tuition fees are fully sponsored will not be eligible to receive VCGS awards. The list of schemes is not exhaustive and applicants should check the regulations for all funding opportunities to which they apply to ensure eligibility.
10. Successful applicants must inform the University if they've been awarded any scholarships/sponsorships that cover full tuition fees. Students breaching this regulation will have their VCGS award suspended and the University will recover any previous payments.

11. The University reserves the right to vary all or any scholarship awards and regulations at its sole discretion.
12. The University's decision on all Vice-Chancellor's Global Scholarship awards and interpretation of rules and regulations shall be final: appeals will not be considered.
