<u>Module</u>: In this example, <u>POL1000</u> is a module code from politics. **BIO** would be Biology, **GEO** Geography etc. The **module title** is viewable in the list format of the timetable or when you **hover the mouse pointer**—**over the cell** in grid format.

Class Type: After the module code, there is further important information (POL1000/<u>L</u>01/<u>01</u>)

<u>L</u>O1 The letter represents the type of class e.g. POL1000/<u>L01</u>/01 here <u>L</u> is a <u>L</u>ecture, other codes you may see are <u>S</u>eminar, <u>C</u>omputer class, <u>T</u>utorial or <u>P</u>ractical. In this example, the number following the letter indicates that this is lecture one of the module, it may have further lectures, seminars or practical classes, e.g. seminar one POL1000/<u>S01</u>/01 or the second seminar in the series POL1000/<u>S02</u>/01. <u>You will be expected to</u>

L01/<u>01</u> The final number in the activity POL1000/L01/<u>01</u> indicates if a class is repeated a number of times to different groups of students e.g. POL1000/S01/<u>01</u>, POL1000/S01/<u>02</u>, POL1000/S01/<u>03</u> are the first, second and third repeats of seminar one for POL1000. <u>Location Code</u>: The location is indicated by an abbreviation. **DAYSH.G.05** is lecture theatre **G.05** in the <u>DAYSH</u> building. **More information on the classroom is displayed** when you **hover the mouse pointer** over a location name. A list of buildings abbreviations is included in this guide.

POL1000 / L01 / 01 DAYSH.G.05 Wks: 5-15, 19

Week Numbers: These numbers indicate the timetable week or range of weeks a class will take place (a guide showing the timetable week and date week beginning is shown at the top of your timetable). In this example, the Lecture will run in weeks 5 to 15 & 19 – all weeks in semester 1.
